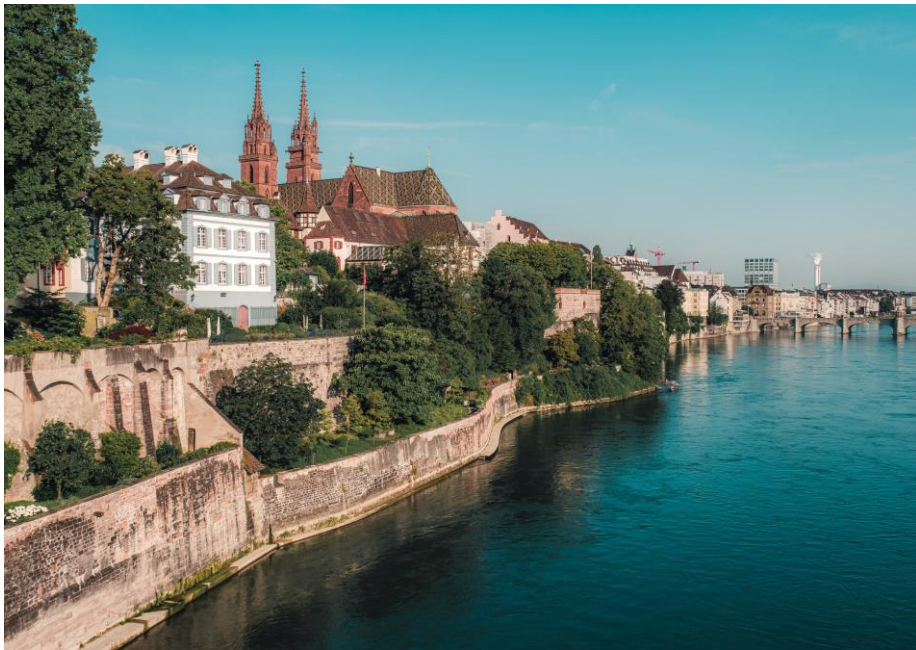

Geneva



International lakeside city strongly influenced by French language and gastronomy.

Day 1

- Arrive Geneva Airport. Regular trains take 8-minutes and run direct from the airport terminal to Geneva main train station. Your hotel is a 7-minute walk or 5-minute bus/tram ride from the train station.
- The hotel provides a city travel pass covering free travel on all trains, buses, trams and water taxis within the city.
- Geneva Choco Pass - explore the city through 8 local chocolate makers. Your pass is active for 24 hours from first use.
- Wine and Boat cruise on Lake Geneva in a solar powered boat. Tutored tasting of 5 Swiss wines, cheese and charcuterie platter and getting up close to the city's iconic Jet d'Eaux water jet.



Day 2

- Cover Geneva's must-see sights with a relaxed pace E-bike tour. Over three hours you'll visit the international district, Botanical Gardens, Lake Geneva's quaysides, parks and bridges.
- Lunch suggestion - Geneva's oldest cafe, Les Armures has traditional and local specialties like Lake Geneva perch in lemon sauce, rosti, tomato fondue etc.
- The craft of fine watchmaking started in Geneva. The Patek Philippe collection showcases 500 years of the craft.
- Shopping time in Rue du Rhône's high-end boutiques and vintage stores.



Basel



World-renowned art, architecture and quirkiness at the river city where France, Germany, and Switzerland meet.

Day 3

- Travel by high-speed train from Geneva to Basel. Journey time is below 3 hrs with a change of train in either Bern, the Swiss capital city, or Biel/Bienne.
- Basel's famous Buvettes are small, lovingly designed, open-air eateries, each with its own special charm.
- Stories of Basel's Old Town private guided tour includes the historic salmon pink Town Hall, Basel Cathedral (Münster), the Barfüsserkerche and picturesque corners of the Old Town.



Day 4

- Kunstmuseum Basel is the world's first public, and one of the top, art museums. Three venues cover a 700-year journey through art history including a "Who's Who" from Pablo Picasso to Henri Matisse and Joan Miró to Paul Klee. Use Basel Card provided by the hotel for 50% discount.
- Self-guide walk around the Spalenberg area, best known for the many small boutiques and fine shops, like the world-famous Johann Wanner Christmas House (hand crafted decorations available all year around), and Jakob's Basler Leckerly (Switzerland's oldest bakery) for traditional Lackerli biscuits.
- Join the locals al-fresco for summer weather at one of the city's popular urban bars on the Rhine, like Sandoase, or a rooftop bar like Viertel Dach or the Hotel Marthof.
